He will reign on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish and sustain it with justice and righteousness from now on and forever. The zeal of the LORD of Hosts will accomplish this. (Isa 9:6-7) Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you believe in Him so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Rom 15:13)

Being in a season of waiting is a pretty common experience, but nobody knows waiting quite like God's people in the Old Testament, who waited in anxious anticipation of the coming Savior for over 400 years!

The Advent season, the four weeks leading up to Christmas, is a time of anxious anticipation of what is to come. This inner turmoil mimics the nervous energy children often have leading up to the arrival of Christmas presents under the tree, and for me, waiting for the arrival of smoldering volcanoes, fragrant lavender fields, sweeping island vistas in the top-down Stang, the death-defying road to Hana, Auntie Sandy's warm banana bread and Mama's Fish House! The Advent season is a cauldron, a season of anticipation, a time to refocus our hearts on Jesus the King as we walk into a season of joy and celebration.

Although Christmas reminds us of the coming of Jesus of Nazareth and the time that He walked the earth, it is also a time to remember that we still anxiously await the second coming of Jesus and the fulfillment of His kingdom. We are still in a season of waiting! We wait with hope for the Savior who would "soon" arrive.

As we prepare for this Advent season, let's pause and redirect our hearts and our hopes to the One who will never fail us, to reflect on the coming arrival of our Savior. When we focus our hearts on Christ, we can use His faithfulness all around us as reminders that we can trust Him in any circumstance, even long periods of waiting. May you and I be confident in our God and in His plan. Like Paul, I pray God would bring you peace and joy in all the different seasons as you remember His faithfulness and trust in Him!



**Bible Studies For Life Summary** A Name Like No Other

> We study aspects of God's name not merely as a theological exercise, but also for application to our daily experience. While honoring God's name is worthy by itself, doing so impacts our lives. We draw closer to Him by knowing more about His nature. We live more securely because His name encourages trust. We love Him better and allow His love to flow through us more fully because of the love expressed in His name.

Why should God's name be important to us? God's name is holy. We demonstrate respect for Him by the way we treat His name. In addition to the commandment not to take God's name in vain (Ex. 20:7), Scriptures demonstrate how God acts for His name's sake (Ps. 23:3; 25:11).

This study will help us understand how God's name reveals His majestic nature. Because of His name, we can trust Him, worship Him, and pray to Him. Whoever calls on Jesus's name will be saved. We appreciate the righteousness of His name. His name encourages us to trust Him with our well-being.

As we study God's name, let's use this opportunity to know and love Him better. Pause along the way and worship Him.
