

Taking Risks

Taking risks can be a way to deepen our faith, trust in God, and demonstrate our belief in His lordship. Putting something valuable, even our lives, involves stepping outside of one's comfort zone and trusting God to guide and provide, even in the face of uncertainty. Yet, we are also encouraged to avoid recklessness and to seek wisdom in discerning appropriate jeopardies. Let's look at a Christian perspective on taking risks:

AS A DEMONSTRATION OF FAITH

Trust in God's Sovereignty: We believe that God is in control and that He works all things for good. Taking risks can be a way of demonstrating trust in His promises and His ability to guide.

Embracing the Unknown: The Bible encourages us to live by faith, not by sight. This means trusting God even when the outcome is uncertain or unknown.

Examples from the Bible: Many biblical figures took risks in obedience to God, such as Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Jesus. Their stories serve as examples of how God can be trusted even when facing potential consequences.

DIFFERENTIATING FOOLISH FROM FAITH-FILLED RISKS

Seeking God's Guidance: As Christians, we are encouraged to pray, seek counsel from others, and use wisdom in discerning whether a particular risk is a step of faith or a reckless move.

Avoiding Recklessness: The Bible condemns foolish risks that are not rooted in faith or godly wisdom. These are risks that are driven by selfishness, fear, or a lack of trust in God.

Balancing Risk and Reward: We should consider the potential outcome and whether the risk is worth it in terms of glorifying God and advancing His kingdom.

EXAMPLES OF RISKS BELIEVERS MIGHT TAKE

Sharing our faith: We might risk social judgment or disapproval by openly sharing our faith with others.

Serving others: We might risk our time, resources, or comfort by serving others, especially those in need.

Following God's calling: We might risk our careers, social status, or personal relationships by following God's calling, even if it means stepping into the unknown.

For us as believers, taking risks can be a powerful way to demonstrate our faith, trust in God, and demonstrate our commitment to His will. It is important to distinguish between foolish risks and Spirit-led, faith-filled risks and to seek wisdom in discerning which risks are appropriate. When done with discernment and a heart of trust, taking risks can lead to growth, joy, and a deeper relationship with God.
