

Pastor David's Corner

Autumn is Upon Us

The teasing ebb & flow of cooler, crisper weather has come. The autumnal equinox has passed, days are officially shorter than the nights, and we have begun to taste the impending declination of the air's thermal, warming effects. The leaves inherit earthy tones, before ultimately giving way to gravitational forces, which eventually send them cascading on delightful waves of morning breezes. Winter is not far away; Fall is here.

This seasonal display is physically manifest for us to see, hear, and feel. It can serve as a spiritual reminder that we are also changing, noticeably, periodically, yet in our case, irreversibly. We are fast transforming and unidirectionally moving seasonally along a similar path. We are getting old; and what follows is scary.

In dealing with the autumn of our lives, especially in consideration of winter's looming, arctic grip, may we trust God, even when aging gets hard. Sure, these times may very well be our most challenging. But, let us remember that He is still in charge of our lives. He actually appoints the aging process. Our older years are His years, and they are ordained for His purposes. So, what does the Bible say?

My mouth is filled with Your praise and with Your glory all day long. Do not cast me off in the time of old age; do not forsake me when my strength fails. (Psalm 71.8-9)

"Listen to Me, O house of Jacob, and all the remnant of the house of Israel, you who have been borne by Me from birth and have been carried from the womb; even to your old age I will be the same, and even to your graying years I will bear you! I have done it, and I will carry you; and I will bear you and I will deliver you." (Isaiah 46.3-4)

For He performs what is appointed for me, and many such decrees are with Him (Job 23.14).

Remember also your Creator in the days of your youth, before the evil days come and the years draw near when you will say, "I have no delight in them"; before the sun and the light, the moon and the stars are darkened, and clouds return after the rain; in the day that the watchmen of the house tremble, and mighty men stoop, the grinding ones stand idle because they are few, and those who look through windows grow dim; . . . then the dust will return to the earth as it was, and the spirit will return to God who gave it. "Vanity of vanities," says the Preacher, "all is vanity!" (Ecclesiastes 12.1-8)

Your eyes have seen my unformed substance; And in Your book were all written the days that were ordained for me, when as yet there was not one of them. (Psalm 139.16)

When life brings us to our final days, weeks, or months, or years we do not know what they will be like. Our time on earth may end unexpectedly or with a slow, painful and debilitating illness. We do not know. But we can anticipate and prepare for hard times. We already have a deep awareness of what those days could be like. We have watched too many friends, family members and loved ones transition. We have watched our parents live their final moments. We read stories and newspaper accounts of these times. We've attended funerals and memorial services.

So, as much as we are able, let's think about and anticipate how we will live now. Let's prepare to live purposefully with a strong mindset of trusting God. James said we should live each day doing the Lord's will and trusting that the results are ultimately up to Him (James 4:15). Also, we should pray as Moses did, "Teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." (Psalm 90:12)




Church Work Day



Bible Studies For Life Summary Navigating Family Conflict

Many eruptions of anger or dysfunction in the workplace, church, traffic, sporting activities (like booing the umpire) and unconstructive conversations can stem from unresolved family conflict.

- We have not called this series *Avoiding Family Conflict*. Changing the subject or sitting farther away from each other does not solve anything.
- It is not called *Denying Family Conflict*. Deny all you want; you will only delay the inevitable work necessary to restore or repair your broken relationships.
- It is not called *Fleeing Family Conflict*. Some people run away, separate, or sever their relationships. You can run, but you can't hide. It's still there.
- It is not called *Blaming Family Conflict*. Because we are often accurate about the other person's fault, we feel justified in blaming them, while excusing ourselves from our responsibility in the conflict.
- It is not called *Repeating Family Conflict*. We want to help you stop making the same mistakes that bring on so much pain.

There are no perfect families. From insights in the book of Genesis, let's find our way through it rather than avoiding, denying, fleeing, blaming, or repeating our family conflicts.
