

Pastor David's Corner

So Many Voices - Only One God

Have you ever stopped to consider the amount of voices you hear in a day, week, month or lifetime? It seems everyone has a sermon to preach, a lesson to teach, a message to impart or a narrative to convey. Noise, noise, noise, noise, noise! Perhaps the grinch was right! Even Jesus pulled away from the crowds and retreated to an elevated solitude, a deserted seclusion, to His Father's still, small voice. Can you identify?

Wouldn't it be nice if we could recoil to such a respite of divine inspiration, encouragement, guidance and hope. Of course, we can, but there is a problem. There's a snake in the garden! We're never alone; us and God. Someone keeps hissing in our ear.

What are we to do? He won't leave us be. He constantly roams about seeking to devour intimate time between us and our Heavenly Father. And he won't shut up!

Our new message series is designed to help in this very important, ongoing battle for our attention, our hearts & minds, and our allegiance. How can we weed through the deception and rightfully discern God's voice above all others, especially the voices of the devil and his minions? Upon first learning that we are valued by God, we move to break down the daily voices and confront each with six basic inquiries.

1) Does this articulation agree with the Bible? Is it backed by the Bible in proper context? 2) Does it bring conviction of sin, righteousness, and judgement? Does it convict of the truth of Jesus as Messiah? 3) Does it call us to trust God? Does it demand faith in Him? 4) Does it align with God's character? Does it move us toward His likeness? 5) Does it honor God? Does it bring glory to His name, His holiness, and His righteousness? 6) Does it lead us to be more like Jesus? Does it mold us into His image to accomplish His purposes?

So many voices. Can you hear them? May we come to a quiet place of discernment, comfort, peace, and clarity. May we rightfully divide their origins and intent as we rightfully divide God's Word and thus show ourselves approved by God. May we hear the utterance of our great Father Shepherd and follow Him into a life of abundance, joy and fruitfulness. May He protect us and provide as we arm ourselves with His truth and share His great gospel message!



The Connect Center is a non-profit organization founded in 2015 by Dr. David Miller and his wife Joan T. Miller. The Connect Center and its ministries focus on real-life issues that plague our communities all over, such as hunger, poverty, and a lack of daily essentials.

Establishing the Connect Center is Dr. Miller's opportunity to align his purpose with God's will, advocate for those who need someone to be their advocate. As well as connecting people with resources and services that he might not have access to.

The Pass Through Store is a place where low-income families, homeless, and foster care families can come shop for clothing, toiletries, shoes, and specialty items at no cost. Pass Through can also provide direct connection with goods, services, and agencies to assist with shoppers' needs.


How to Discern the Voice of God
